This is a submission on the following proposed plan change Plan Change 58 to Tasman District Council District Plan – Wakefield Strategic Review

- 2. The NZ Transport Agency could not gain an advantage in trade completion through this submission.
- 3. We wish to be heard on this matter.

4. Role of the NZ Transport Agency

The NZ Transport Agency (the 'Agency') is a Crown entity providing an integrated approach to transport planning, investment and delivery. The Agency's statutory objective is to undertake its functions in a way that *contributes to an affordable, integrated, safe, responsive and sustainable land transport system*. It aims to create transport solutions for a thriving New Zealand and does this through four key functions, which are:

- 1. Planning the land transport networks (with partners)
- 2. Investing in land transport (with partners)
- 3. Managing the State Highway network, and
- 4. Providing access to and use of the land transport system.

The Transport Agency acknowledges the importance of the issues relating to the supply of suitably zoned land in Tasman and is committed to ensuring a high degree of alignment in the planning for growth and the safety and any required infrastructure investment.

5. Submission

The Agency opposes in part Plan Change 58. The Agency supports the Council's desire to provide suitable and adequate residential and industrial land for future development. We would like to work

with Council to enable adequate resolution of the Agency's issues, and ensure that good integrated planning principles are achieved.

The Agency supports residential development that occurs in a considered and consistent manner, taking into account past planning decisions as well as long term strategic plans; including infrastructure.

While the Agency is generally supportive of development, we have several areas of concern with the proposed plan change. These stem primarily from the lack of sufficient information provided in the notification documentation on the potential direct effects on State Highway 6, and consideration of any flow on effects on the highway network from the development areas located further away from the highway. Our specific concerns are detailed below. Please note, our information is entirely based on what has been provided with notification. We note that in general, early involvement in the planning of proposed developments will better enable early resolution of any issues prior to notification.

Drainage

The Agency notes that there are existing capacity issues associated with the (Council owned) stormwater drainage network in the immediate vicinity of the proposed residential zone, near Bird Lane. Given the proposed location of the residential zone, the Agency needs to be assured that this will not be further exacerbated by the additional of a residential zone. Any potential adverse effects on the State Highway will need to be mitigated.

The Agency seeks that Council undertake, or provide, an assessment of the effects of the development on the drainage systems in the vicinity of the new residential zone. If there are any adverse effects on the Agency's assets, this would need to be satisfactorily mitigated before the Agency could consider supporting this element of the Plan Change.

Indicative roads joining the State Highway

The Agency has identified two new indicative roads being proposed that adjoin the State Highway. The Agency has not been involved with any discussion regarding the establishment of these new roads. The Section 32 report does not appear to outline why the indicative roads are required or explain why they are proposed where they are. Without this information, we are unsure how and why the indicative roads are deemed necessary. The Agency notes that there are numerous existing local routes that could be better utilised, and recommends these opportunities are explored further. It is our view that alternatives need to be explored and discussed with the Agency before any commitment to a connecting road is made. Given the Agency is an affected Road Controlling Authority, it is essential to involve us early in discussions regarding additional roads to ensure the effective alignment between the local and state highway networks.

The Agency seeks that analysis regarding the indicative road locations be provided so that a discussion can occur regarding appropriateness, and to allow elements such as safety and efficiency to be explored. This will ensure the best possible outcome is achieved for everyone. Until such time that the Agency are satisfied with any indicative road layout that connects to the State Highway, we would request that an indicative roads are removed from the Plan Change.

Impacts on State Highway Intersections

There are potential capacity and safety issues at two existing intersections that need to be further explored given the location of the proposed new residential and industrial zones. The intersections that are of specific concern are;

• Martin Ave / State Highway 6

• Bird Lane / State Highway 6

The Agency seeks that an assessment is undertaken to establish whether these intersections are able to continue to function at a safe and appropriate service level; and if not, what work is required to upgrade the intersections until they meet a sufficient standard. The Agency would like to see the results of these assessments.

The Agency looks forward to working with Council to resolve outstanding issues in a constructive manner.

Item 4 planning Maps-4.1.1 and 4.1.2 intention to add new indicative walkways to our property (Brooks Valley Farm Ltd)

I oppose these provisions in relation to walkways on or adjacent to our property.

Remove the proposed walkways (maps 52/4, map 58 and 91) on or adjacent to our property.

My reasons include but are not limited to:

- it would have substantial. adverse animal welfare effects on all stock farmed in this area and in particular deer
- This would have a substantial negative impact on productivity of our land (this would be an adverse effect on productivity as detailed in Chapter 7 of the TRMP)
- -This impact could make the farm uneconomic affecting the employment of staff and numerous suppliers and sub-contractors.
- It is well recognised (including by TDC) that land framentation is a real concern in the region affecting the sustainable productivity of rural Tasman area.
- The effects of this walkway would be such that the land could no longer be used for deer farming, the land would be uneconomic and would be subdivided.
- The land in question is critical to to the success of farming the adjacent highly productive Rural Zone 1 land. The association is not only economic. The rolling land provides low intensity stand -off areas in wet periods providing both environmental and animal welfare benefits +

- Health and Safety concerns regarding public entering this area of the farm including, cattle, deer heavy machinery fencing, planting crops and feeding out and our requirement to use firearms for pest control of animals which are not only pests but also vectors for transmittal of TB.

- This is made worse by most of the proposed walkway being located out of site from the farm houses. In addition to health and safety concerns there are now real concerns with rural crime and stock harassment or theft. In recent weeks there have been numerous articles from both the Police and farming organizations. This walkway goes through central and isolated areas of the farm heightening these risks.
- -There are already substantial issues with sheep measles in our area. Even if TDC put up NO DOGS signs -this will not deter people as we have regularly observed on other walkways. See website

http://www.sheepmeasles.co.nz which states in part; "Foreign Dogs - Foreign or external dogs pose a risk to any on-farm programme in place. Unless you are aware of their status in relations to Sheep Measles treatment all foreign dogs should be deterred."


Numerous parties benefited (down to the tour bus operators) - but they came to see a productive farm.
