Submission on Private Plan Change Request 61: Wainui Bay Spat Catching

The Ministry for Primary Industries (the Ministry) makes this submission on the proposal by the Wainui Bay Spat Catching group for a plan change to the Tasman Resource Management Plan (Plan Change 61).

The Ministry is focussed on 'growing and protecting New Zealand', and Plan Change 61 encompass both aspects of the Ministry's purpose.

The Ministry generally supports Plan Change 61, with some amendments relating to biosecurity management – see "Biosecurity" section below. The Ministry's submission focuses on:

- the importance of the Wainui Bay spat catching site for aquaculture; and
- biosecurity.

The importance of the Wainui Bay spat catching site for aquaculture

Aquaculture is the fastest growing component of New Zealand's seafood sector with sales totalling over \$450 million per annum. The aquaculture industry aims to continue this growth and has set itself a goal of \$1 billion of sales per annum by 2025. This is supported by the Government's 2012 Aquaculture Strategy and Five-year Action Plan.

Mussel farming comprises a significant proportion of the aquaculture industry and is dependent on a reliable source of mussel spat. The Wainui Bay spat catching farms are of national importance to the mussel industry as one of two key sources of mussel spat (the other being Ninety Mile Beach). Wainui Bay spat provides roughly 20% of the spat grown nationally (and around 50% in the Tasman and Marlborough regions). It is also harvested at a different time of the year to Ninety Mile Beach ensuring a year-long supply of mussels.

Plan Change 61 seeks to provide greater certainty to both the Wainui Bay Spat Catching group and the wider mussel farming industry that the spat catching farms in Wainui Bay can continue beyond the current term of consent (due to expire in 2024). This is consistent with Policy 8 of the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement (NZCPS) which requires the significant existing and potential contribution of aquaculture to the social, economic and cultural well-being of people and communities to be recognised. The Ministry supports the intent of this plan change as certainty over this nationally significant spat supply is crucial to the sustainable growth ambitions of the sector.

Biosecurity

The Ministry has an important regulatory and administering function with respect to the New Zealand biosecurity system, a fundamental component of the Ministry's focus on 'protecting' the current and future value (and growth potential) of New Zealand's primary sectors.

Given the importance of the Wainui Bay spat to the mussel farming industry and the nature of its operation, it is critical that best practice biosecurity management measures are put in place through Plan Change 61 to manage the adverse effects of harmful aquatic organisms and diseases on this location as a significant spat source but also the potential spread from this location to recipient mussel farming areas.

The Ministry asks that the Tasman District Council ensure spat catching and holding operations managed under Plan Change 61 contain specific requirements for best practice biosecurity management.

The Ministry is developing best practice guidance at the moment and is happy to work with the council on suitable conditions.

The Plan Change Process

The Ministry welcomes this opportunity to submit on the application. We wish to be heard in support of our submission. If others make a similar submission we will consider presenting a joint case with them at a hearing.

I am a shareholder in Golden Bay Marine Farmers Consortium Ltd and fully support the plan change application, for the same reasons stated by the applicant, namely certainty of supply from this consistently reliable and high quality spat settlement site.

When all the new space for mussel farming is resolved in the High Court in May 2016, and MPI's Final Aquaculture Decision is implemented, every available source of spat catching and holding will be vital and required to allow the industry to reach the potential envisaged by the Environment Court when the other 3 AMA's were created, some 18 years ago.

I seek that the TDC rename Wainui Bay as AMA 4 Wainui, with mussel spat catching and holding becoming controlled activities.
