PROPOSAL FOR REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF BOCCE COURTS, BEACH RESERVE, NORTH STREET, MOTUEKA

A. BACKGROUND

- As Council may be aware, the Bocce Courts at Beach Reserve, Motueka ("the Bocce Courts") were opened on 4 May 1996 by the Community Board.
- Today, these Courts are used regularly by the Motueka Special Olympics Organisation, Woodlands Rest Home and Village, the general public and tourists visiting our region.
- Council may be aware that over the years limited maintenance appears to have been carried out on the Bocce Courts and as a result they are now in a state of disrepair, they are unsafe and a health and safety hazard.

B. CONCERNS

- 4. There are exposed nails within the framing of the courts which are extremely hazardous, causing concern for everyone using the courts, particularly the elderly and those with special needs and physical disabilities.
- Loose (peametal) gravel has been dumped on the surface of the courts making it uneven, unsafe and unsuitable for the purpose. Further, the existing material is not the correct product for Bocce or Petanque as it cannot be compacted.
- 6. The timber edgings of the courts are warped which makes them difficult to use, they are not the correct height and most importantly they are a hazard.

C. PROPOSAL

- 7. That the Council undertake urgent repairs and maintenance to the Bocce Courts to bring them up to an acceptable health and safety standard. That all remedial work is carried out to the required national standard for construction of Bocce / Petanque courts. This would make them user friendly and a valuable asset to the community.
- The submitters of this proposal would appreciate the opportunity to meet with Council at the Bocce Courts to discuss any repairs or maintenance prior to any works being carried out.
