- vi) The Council shall charge rates revenue as security for the loan and the performance of its obligations pursuant to the loan documentation.
- vii) The Council acknowledges that by charging rates revenue, the Council is deemed to have made a special rate of such amount each year, on the rateable value of every rateable property in the district, as is sufficient to provide in that year for the payment of its commitments in respect of the loan or loan documentation during that year plus 10% thereof until the loan is repaid or the obligations incurred under the loan documentation are fully performed.

- viii) The Council has considered the risks and benefits to the Council of the loan and loan documentation and of the security to be given in relation to the loan and loan documentation.
- ix) The Council is satisfied that the general terms and conditions of the loan and loan documentation and of the security to be given in relation to the loan and loan documentation are in accordance with the borrowing management policy adopted by the Council and, in particular, the limits and guidelines set out in that borrowing management policy.
- x) The Council delegates to the Chief Executive and the Corporate Services Manager the authority to further determine the precise terms and conditions of the loan, loan documentation and security, to be negotiated at the best current terms and conditions, such terms and conditions to be advised to the Council following the raising of the loan.

### 4 PORT NELSON SHARE BUY-BACK FUND

Mr Staite spoke to his report which sought approval from Council to repay \$12.5 million of debt from the Port Nelson Share Buy-back fund.

Cr Higgins asked if the fund was used to repay infrastructural loans, eg water system, would it be possible for a return to be obtained from that capital back to the Council general budget.

Cr Bryant said we're looking at repaying debt when we've just approved \$25 million debt. A sector of the community asked us to do something special with it, eg performing arts centre.

Cr Inglis is opposed to repaying debt with the fund. He believes it could be put into the Lee Valley Dam or invested with the interest used to repay debt.

Mr Staite said we would want to pay back the highest interest bearing debt.

Cr Currie was against the retiring of debt. We definitely have a water problem and we should put in place a secure water supply and said the \$12.5 million would help the region's water problem.

Cr Norriss said Council must be careful to ensure the \$12.5 million benefits every ratepayer in the Tasman District.

Mayor Kempthorne supports repaying debt and ensuring that everybody benefits.

Cr Dowler said the Port dividend should stay with Council earning as much interest as possible, with the interest used to keep the general rate down.

Cr Ensor said it would be hard to find a project that would benefit all ratepayers of the District.

Cr King said if the money is invested, the capital amount will be worth a lot less in years to come.

Cr Higgins said \$500,000 of our current year's cashflow comes from earnings from the investment of this money. The reduction needs to benefit all ratepayers.
