

Summer swimming water monitoring underway

Each summer we increase our water quality monitoring at popular swimming and recreational water locations around the Tasman District.

We're fortunate in this District to have very good water quality overall – 98% of our popular swimming spots meet the Government's "swimmable" standard.

Results are posted on our website and updated regularly throughout the summer, so you can check the water quality at your favourite swimming hole or beach before you head out: www.tasman.govt.nz/link/swimming-water.

The risk of catching an infectious disease from swimming in clear, clean water is usually low. However, after rainfall, contamination occurs through runoff into waterways.

To minimise the risk of exposure to harmful bacteria it is best not to swim in discoloured water, for at least the first 24 hours – and preferably 36 hours – after heavy rainfall.

Toxic Algae

We also keep a close eye on rivers for toxic algae during the summer months and post results to our website.

Extended periods of warm weather and low, slow river flows create conditions where algae is more likely to become toxic.

Mats of algae can produce toxins which are dangerous for children and pets. Keep an eye on children and dogs near the water – and don't let them eat any algae. You can report large mats of algae by phoning us on 03 543 8400.

Community Services Committee – 7 December 2017

 A report about Tasman District Libraries' recent work included an update on the 1000 Books before School reading programme, a collaboration between Motueka Library and Motueka Family Service Centre. Reading aloud and talking to children is crucial for the development of language and literacy. Ideally, all children are read at least 1000 books before they get to school and this

- programme will support and encourage parents and caregivers to reach this goal.
- The committee heard a draft Reserve Management Plan for Motueka's parks, playgrounds, sportsfields and other reserves has been delayed due to staff workloads, and is now likely to be ready for public consultation in late 2018.
- The committee heard that community feedback on the current and future needs of older residents identified housing, transport and footpaths as the main areas for improvement. The feedback will be considered as part of the LTP 2018-2028 and will inform policy development across the Council, such as development of an Age-Friendly Policy.

It's property revaluation time

The Tasman District's three-yearly revaluation of property values has been done, and your new valuation is on its way – if you haven't received it already.

The effective date for this revaluation is 1 September 2017, and any objections to your property's revaluation must be made to QV by 9 February 2018.

Impact on rates

The 2017 revaluations will be used as a basis for distributing individual rates obligations for the next three financial years, starting from 1 July 2018.

An increase in your property's valuation does not automatically mean an increase in your rates bill. The revaluation does not increase or decrease our total rating income but it does affect how rates are allocated across the District's ratepayers.

If you think of the Council's rates income as a pie, the size of the pie does not increase because of the revaluation. However, your slice of pie might get bigger if your property value has increased by more than the average.

An increase to your rates bill could result if:

- · Your property value increases by more than the average increase for the rating
- Your property value alters as a result of new improvements being added - e.g. consented building work.

Rates set on a uniform charge basis (e.g. Uniform Annual General Charge, District Facilities Rate, etc.) are not affected by a district-wide revaluation.

Objections

If you feel your property's rating value doesn't reflect your property's market value (as at 1 September 2017), you have the right to object. Objections allow valuers to assess individual components which may not have been considered in the process (e.g. building work that didn't require a consent).

The closing date to lodge an objection to your new rating value is 9 February 2018. There are no fees for lodging an objection by this date.

Part of Reilly Street closed to vehicles

Gates have been installed to restrict vehicle access to the unsealed section of Reilly Street in Takaka. The change is intended to address problems including antisocial behaviour, litter and environmental health issues related to large groups of people camping.

Pedestrians and cyclists can still use the area, and private landowners and other stakeholders (such as emergency services) have keys for continued access.

Locals and the police have been very concerned about the behaviour of groups of campers in the area. We advise campers to use Waitapu Bridge instead, which is a more appropriate location for camping and

has a toilet. We have applied for Tourism Infrastructure Fund money to improve the facilities at Waitapu Bridge.

The new restriction has been added to the Traffic Control Devices Register in our Traffic Control Bylaw, and came into effect on 1 December 2017.

Work to create Waimea River Park continues

Work to restore native plantings and improve the recreational values of land along the eastern bank of the Waimea River, as part of the Waimea River Park development, is progressing.

The Waimea River Park is a long term project to enhance the river environment and improve recreational opportunities such as walking, cycling and horse riding on Council-owned land beside the Waimea River.

Vehicle access is being progressively restricted, parking areas created, and additional native plantings and recreation facilities provided over time.

Latest developments

- The muddy area on the eastern bank upstream of Appleby Bridge has been filled, shaped and prepared for grassing, which will take place in autumn 2018.
- Vehicle access to the river bank via Blackbyre Road is still available, but there is no access via Bartletts Road.
- The design for the new access road to the Fish Out Ponds an extension to Challies Road off Waimea West Road - is nearly complete.

Next steps

A new parking area at the Clover Road West end of the riverbank will be developed over the summer, and unauthorised vehicle

access restricted at this point. This will allow the development of the area immediately upstream of the bridge in a manner similar to the park on the other side of the highway, which incorporates flat areas with barbecues and easy access to the swimming hole.

Nominations called for Golden Bay By-Election

We are currently calling for nominations for a vacancy on the Golden Bay Community Board. If you are passionate about your community, a good listener and communicator, can digest and analyse a wide variety of written material and think you can make decisions that are in the best interests of your community – consider putting your hand up. A by-election for the vacant Community Board seat will be held on Saturday 17 February 2018.

Make a nomination: Nominations are open until noon on Friday 22 December 2017. Pick up a nomination form from our Takaka or Richmond offices, or online at www.tasman.govt.nz. A deposit of \$200 (including GST) is required, which can be paid by eftpos, cash or cheque.

How do you want to be represented?

We're about to carry out a representation review, which looks at how many councillors should be elected, if they are to be elected by ward or the District as a whole and, if by ward, the number of wards, their boundaries and names. Consideration of a Maori ward: The Council last month resolved not to establish a Maori ward for the 2019 local council elections. More feedback will be sought from iwi to consider whether the establishment of a Maori ward should be considered prior to the 2022 election

Road resealing work begins

Our annual road resealing programme is underway to ensure a safe and properly maintained road network.

Work begins on roads in Richmond, followed by Brightwater and Wakefield, before breaking for the holiday period. Work will then resume in January, beginning in Murchison, followed by Waimea, Golden Bay, Riwaka and Tapawera. All the resealing is expected to be completed by the end of February 2018.

We try to minimise inconvenience for residents where possible, and respectfully ask everyone to be patient and follow any directions from the contractors on site. Please note that on-road parking will be restricted on work sites and there will be temporary limited access to property for pedestrians and vehicles during the construction. This is to allow full access for the construction machinery and allow the job to be completed as quickly as possible.

Motueka Aerodrome Management Plan review

The Motueka Aerodrome Management Plan, which was first adopted in 2011, has undergone a complete review. The draft management plan 2017 and its partnering development plan are now available for comment. The consultation period closes on 7 February 2018.

Copies of both plans are available either online at tasman.govt.nz or at the Motueka Library and Council offices in Motueka and Richmond. The Plan coordinates the aerodrome's use, operations, maintenance and development with the aerodrome users. It includes an emergency plan, development plan, aerodrome information plan and a memorandum of understanding between the Council as the aerodrome operator and aerodrome users. As well as a general update, the updated Emergency Plan (which is already in use) is a feature. Along with minor changes to existing text, the Development Plan has had a new section added for use with future developments.
