SUBJECT: Consideration of Submission Issues

PURPOSE

To identify for discussion a number of issues raised by submitters to Council's draft LTCCP that will require consideration prior to the adoption of Council's final LTCCP.

BACKGROUND

Council received 548 written submissions to its draft LTCCP, of which 153 submitters indicated a preference to verbally present their submission to Council.

Council held a series of submission hearing meetings on 2, 6, 7, 9, 12, 15 and 16 June 2006. During the course of those meetings a number of issues were identified, some of which were discussed at length during a Council workshop held on Wednesday 14 June 2006.
