My family and myself regularly walk our dogs in the sand-spit area. The Kumera's as we know it.

I have lived in the area for many years and know the sand spit very well as I often ride my horse along the beach area.

I have never seen any birds been hurt by any dogs in this area. If dogs are running along the beach the birds just fly off and land in a different area.

When we ride past birds, they stay standing (on one leg) sometime in large groups not even noticing we are there.

When ever I am riding or walking our dogs, every dog owner that approaches us with their dogs, always call their dogs into them, reattaching their leads or sitting their dogs and stopping their barking as we ride or walk past. All dog owners I see are very courteous and considerate to others on the beach. I have never seen a dog fight.

Dog owners always use the doggy bags supplied. People that bother to exercise their dogs are proving they are responsible people.

The wind or sea every day is continually changing the landscape. Some days I can see were the sea has completely washed over some of the sand spit washing everything out in its path. All foot/hooof prints are washed away.

The landscape is completely a different shape than just a few years ago. Trees have washed into the sea and farmland has been lost.

If this place was ever prohibited for dogs or horses, there would be no other area in Motueka were you could run your dogs freely or ride a horse up to 20km span at one time.

This is not a big area for farming so dogs cannot worry stock.

I often meet tourist down on the beach, who have their dogs with them. They love this area.

This is a playground still in its natural state with rocks, gravel, mud, drift wood, tidal outlets to cross or swim, grasses and brush to explore.

We find you cant let your dogs run off to far out when the tide is fully out as the oyster shells and other crustaceans cut the dogs feet to shreds.

The birds have all of the Able Tasman, we only have one beach.

Please **Do Not** make this beach a "Prohibited or Leash controlled" area for dogs or stop us riding our horses on such a easy to access beach.

Erosion will eventually take our sand spit away from us but we won't let the TDC take it from us before this happens.

Everybody must give their animals the necessities of life, and free range (not recklessly unsupervised) exercise is paramount to this. There has never been a need for restrictions on the spit, there is room for all, as there has always been.

Comment to my submission. It has a sensible compromise, so please read it.

There are few places one can take an unleashed dog in today's PC world. Dogs benefit enormously from having the freedom to run, explore, socialize and generally do what dogs should do. Socializing prevents them from growing up aggressive. Surely the Kumaras and environs should be such a place, one of joyous canines.

As a compromise, the far reaches of the sandspit could become a wilderness area (accessible to no-one), to protect the visiting and indigenous birds, who very quickly learn that there are places where they will never be disturbed, and will go to these sanctuaries.

The beachfront walkway should also be an unleashed area. In 25 years of using this, I have never seen any trouble with unleashed dogs, only with leashed animals angry at their restriction. Older citizens who would find it difficult to negotiate the beach with an unleashed dog can so easily do so on the walkway.

Dogs naturally chase birds. Although mine are of spaniel (and several other)descent, which are bird dogs, I have trained them to sit when told, and come when called, thus preventing them from engaging in any nefarious practices. The great majority of dogs being exercised in the area are similarly controlled.

To those among you who do not like or understand animals, have a care for those who do, and have a care too for senior citizens who need canine companionship, and somewhere easily accessible, where they can let their pets frolic, unrestricted.

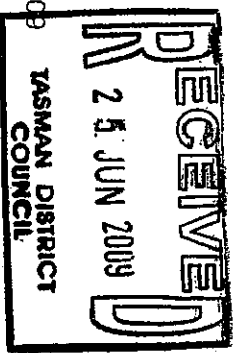
Having read the leaflet on the draft policy and bylaw including a summary, which accompanied the dog registration papers 2009, there is a glaring omission of clause 3.4.2, which is one of the more important clauses. Should this be implemented it will negate d) under the heading: **In adopting a policy on dogs, council must have regard to: the exercise and recreational needs of dogs and their owners.**

Implementing this clause will drive the thin edge of a very large wedge TDC, the local Forest and Bird Society and Ornithological Society of NZ wish to force on the responsible dog owners of Motueka. If allowed to proceed unhindered it will eventually lead to the banning of horse riders and walkers who, like dogs and their owners, enjoy a peaceful walk along the Motueka sand spit.

Although the Motueka sand spit is not specifically identified, it is common knowledge that the aforementioned societies have a hidden agenda to block access to all two and four legged users of a publically owned resource. The concern they express regarding damage to nesting birds is, in my view, simply scaremongering. I would venture to suggest more damage is caused by feral cats, stoats, weasels and people on quad bikes. I have no problem with the nesting area being closed off to everyone during the breeding season, that makes perfect sense, but there is absolutely no necessity for it to be closed year round – that is stretching the bounds of reasoning too far.

Dogs catching birds? Yes this probably does happen but would be a rarity, not a common occurrence as the Forest and Bird and their cohorts would have you believe. If that does happen, it would usually be because the bird is sick or old – nature's way of dealing with a problem. If those who object to dogs being allowed to run free (with their owners nearby) took time to watch, they would see the birds are not petrified by a dog running past. It is more a game to them as they just land a few metres away and so on. Surely if they were that petrified they would fly right away and return later, when the "supposed" danger has gone (birds are not stupid).

The sand spit is an amazing resource for all who wish to use it, whether for exercise (personal and dog walking), bird watching or horse riding. It would be a crime for it to be closed to **all users** by an over protective minority.

Submission to Draft Dog Control Bylaw 2009

I would like to submit in opposition to the CBD area of Commercial Street, Takaka, becoming a dog leash control area.

As a member of the Golden Bay community, I see no reason why dogs (whether on or off the leash) should take over our shopping area, which is certainly what happened last holiday season.

The specific points I wish to make are:

- While faeces are able to be picked up and disposed of, it is impossible to 'pick up' urine that some dogs delight in spraying on every object they walk past! One business owner recently had to resort to throwing a bucket of water over an area outside her café where a dog had urinated; it had previously walked past two other objects and sprayed them – seemingly with an inexhaustible supply! During the last holiday season I watched while a dog owner patiently waited while his dog (on a leash) sprayed a sign outside Take Note. They then unconcernedly walked on!
- It is noted in the Dog Prohibited Areas (Schedule 3) that dogs are banned within 10 metres of playground equipment and picnic tables; Commercial Street has a number of outside eating places; it would be nigh on impossible to prevent dogs from being within 10metres of the tables as they walk down the street. Shoppers – adults and children - should have the right to animal-free eating, and shopping areas.
- When I have asked in the past why there has been a reluctance on the part of Council to administer the 'Dogs Banned in the Shopping Area' of Commercial Street, (the current bylaw), the answer has been that dogs on the leash would bring Takaka into line with other Tasman District towns and make administering the bylaw easier. I don't consider that to be a valid argument and as I have never yet seen a dog on the street in Richmond or Motueka, surely it would be far simpler to make all the other towns dog prohibited areas? However, if those towns do want dogs in their shopping areas I see no reason for Takaka to have to be the same – let the rules reflect what the people of an area want.
- I want to be able to walk along the street and know I'm not going to step in dog poop and that clothing and other items that are displayed outside shops have not been urinated on.

My Comment.

Takaka Township.

I want to see the current dog law remain in Takaka for the following reasons.

Takaka town is more rural and has a much smaller imprint than Richmond or Motueka. It is the larger of two towns in rural Golden Bay and the only one with many differing businesses therefore used by all people of the bay. Therefore I would gauge the percentage of possible visiting dogs per street length to be far greater than in Richmond or Motueka. Therefore dog problems have a greater impact.

Even if under owner guidance dogs can't be prevented from piddling etc if they have the urge. Not all faeces can be easily removed. This depends on consistency.

Since the establishment of the Village Green, a grassy area where on fine days though out the year both locals and tourists choose to sit, meet and eat while toddlers play, often rolling about, this law has become even more necessary. The odd stray dog has been despoiling the area despite the law.

Also now there are at least three eating establishments with pavement tables in Takaka.

Large dogs have been observed with their owners along side the tables their mouths at table level. I guess that, despite the law, café owners have been reluctant to discourage business by bringing the law to the customers' attention even though hygiene is in question.

This problem has been exacerbated by inclusion in a recent TDC walkers' booklet of a walk that is advised through Commercial Street for dogs with owners even though this is in direct contravention of the current law. This information needs to be erased from each booklet before any more are sold or ordered.

The "no dog" sign near the Museum end of town has been heavily encroached by bushes and is only visible now from about one and a half metres distance. Bushes need to be trimmed back so that the sign can be seen from a distance of seven metres as it used to be.

Enforcing The Law.

With the current practice being that TDC Richmond must be informed before an enforcer in Golden Bay can take action in the town on this law, offenders have gone before the permitted action can be taken. Someone in the Takaka TDC Office with the authority to action a complaint immediately is needed.

Elsewhere wardens situated in Collingwood, Puponga, Westhaven, Pohara and Wainui Bay with authority to act immediately would give better coverage. This is a far flung area compared to others under TDC jurisdiction.

Informing people of the allowable dog walking areas is important. The Takaka TDC Office could have the map of areas on the glass door. The Info Centre could include these in a visitors' pack if people bring dogs here.

I know of people who believe they can walk their dogs on Rototai Beach, not understanding that it is only the grassed reserve area where it is possible to do this. When dog licenses are renewed these maps could be given out.

I have heard of dogs being encouraged to disturb the godwits which are preparing for there long flight across the world. Public education and enforcement of the law is necessary.

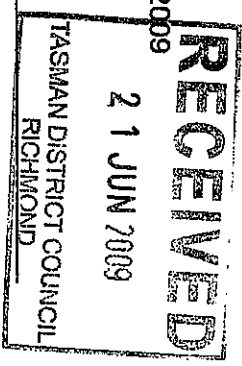

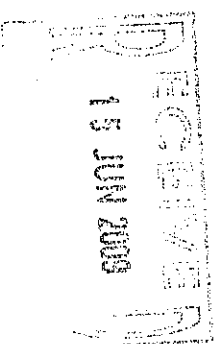

Tasman District Council continues to overlook the needs of toy dogs (and yes I am serious.) They do have quite different needs from other dogs because they are small, lap dogs. They're house dogs because they wouldn't cope anywhere else. Breeds include Chihuahua, Papillion and the toy poodle.

It is very important to remember that not all small dogs are toys. For example a terrier is small but can never be regarded as a toy. They're much too active, aggressive and enjoy hunting. Toys do not!

We pay \$44 per year to register our toys. That has to be the most expensive desk and paper work ever. One time you had a responsible owner discount which made sense but now we pay full fees. What do we get for our fees? A disk and annual inspection of our houses (toy dogs don't live in kennels). Just how many toy dogs do you get in the pound, see roaming the street, savage passersby, bark all night/day long? And why do they rarely cause a problem? Because toy dogs live with their owners, they ride in cars, curl up by the fire, sleep on beds and are generally part of the family. They're not bored, lonely or lacking exercise. They're special.

Here is an extract from The Kennel Association about Papillion which is pretty typical for most toy dogs:

Temperament: The Papillion is an intelligent dog breed who is easy to train. It is one of the most obedient and responsive dogs in the toy group. Friendly and playful, the Papillion gets along with all the family members and pets. Some can be timid.

Upkeep: The lively Papillion thrives on mental stimulation and it enjoys a daily walk on leash as well as challenging games indoors and out. This is not a breed to live outdoors. Its coat is virtually carefree, requiring only occasional brushing to remove dead hair.

So what does TDC do for toy dogs? The answer is NOTHING!

Toy dogs like to run and play like other dogs. They just don't like having to run and play where the grass is long and the ground rough. They don't like meeting big scary dogs or sharing their exercise area with horses and motorbikes yet this is only kind of exercise area you provide for them. It is high time you remedied this situation.

Toy dog owners are probably the most responsible and caring of all and it is time some consideration was given to us. If you plan to continue to overcharge us, then I think we have right to expect that you will provide a suitably mown exercise area in town exclusively for our use.

On popular and well used beaches, dogs should be on a leash. Where there are free roaming dogs these impinge on the rights of people (especially children) who should be able to enjoy their activities without the perceived or real threat of dogs. Also dogs urinating and defecating on the beach, and picnic areas close to the beach is a health issue. Unfortunately not all dog owners pick up their doggy dos

Dogs should not be able to freely chase the birds as they do presently.

We have frequently observed dogs chasing birds on Papa Para beach where there is a rich variety of bird life and these birds should be allowed to feed without disruption.

Para Para and Patons Rock Beaches should be included in Schedule 1.

Additions to Schedule 3 – Dog Prohibited Areas

Commercial Street Takaka

This should continue as a Dog Prohibited Area.

Dogs, even on leashes, defecate and urinate. There is a proliferation of cafes and eating areas in Commercial Street and people should not be subjected to urine and other dog related odours around tables and chairs. It is unhealthy and offensive to have dogs drooling and slobbering while people are eating and drinking.

There are people (especially children) who are genuinely afraid of dogs and they should not have to confront dogs in a congested area such as the Main Street of Takaka, especially in the Summer Months when there are so many tourists in the town. 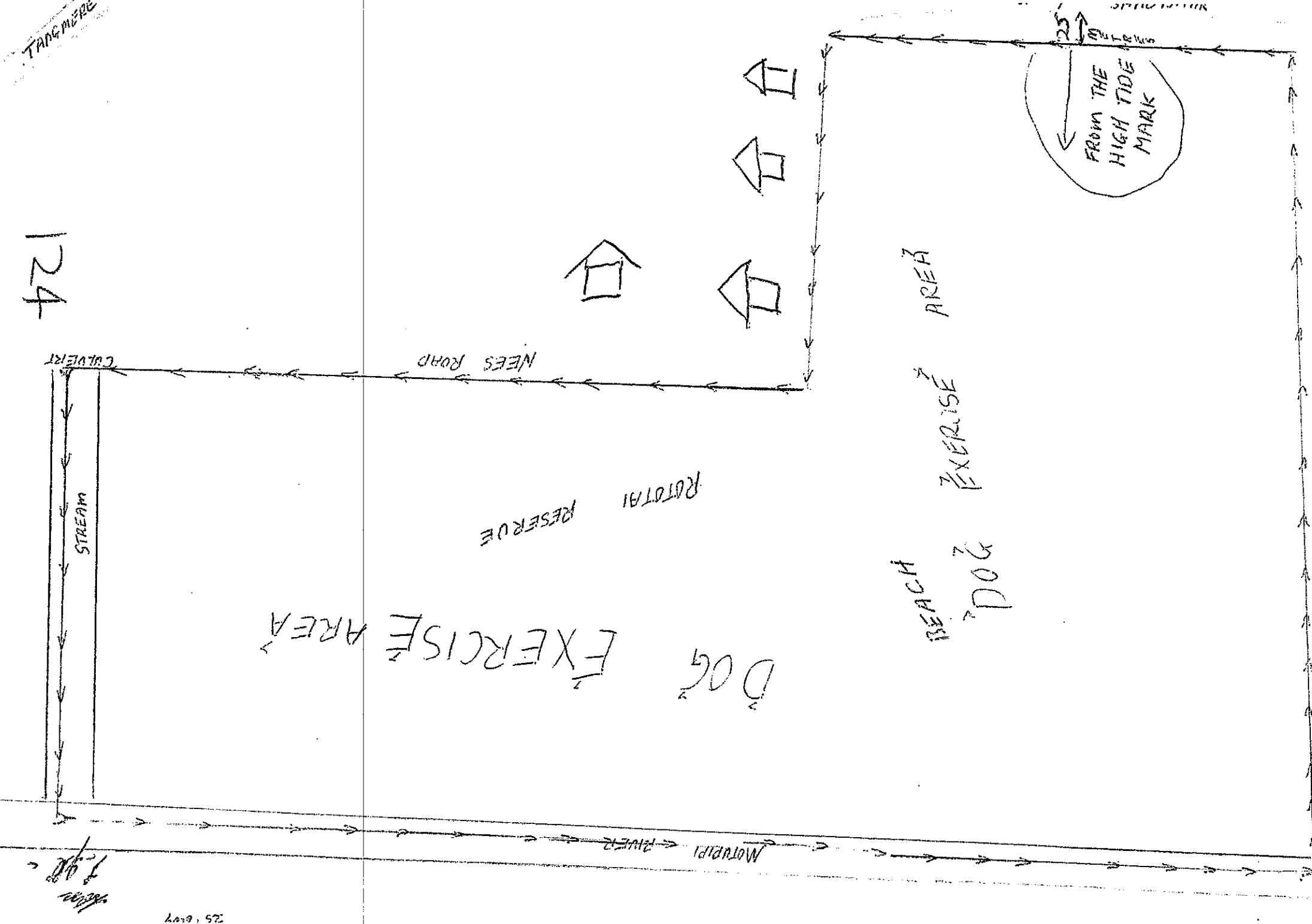

On the map in the draft plan on Page maps.doc 14 the area available does not extend around the headland of Rangihaeata but all of the users of this area presently tend to walk the circuit from the end of Rangihaeata Road along the Esplanade area, around the headland, along Rangihaeata Beachfront and then either up Fenwick or Fraser Road roadends.

The concern we have is that as the Controlled Dog Exercise Area does not extend fully to cover these areas problems could occur in the future, especially as on page maps.doc 33 some of the area adjacent to the headland is shown as being a dog prohibited area. Historically dogs have exercised in this area without any problems to human or birdlife. Although this area is an important estuarine area, the presence of the old Takaka Riverbed which follows the headland out to sea gives birdlife a buffer zone that dogs do not tend to cross and therefore no disturbance is caused to the birdlife. This is not a breeding area for birds with the exception of Little Blue Penguin, and the area is completely submerged during all but the lowest of tides. The penguins are usually at sea during the day when dogs are out with there owners, and during the moulting season are well hidden from inquisitive dogs.

We would like to see the controlled dog exercise area extended right around the headland to the end of Fraser Road. By using the old riverbed as a boundary adjacent to the Waitapu Estuary an easily identifiable boundary on the ground can be used by the dog owners. The main beach at Rangihaeata is not used by swimmers due to it's tidal nature. We have lived in this area for over 5 years and have observed dog users and believe that these changes could be implemented to the detriment of no one and the benefit of many. It is happening anyway and would prevent what could become a future issue if someone was so minded.

We hope that these changes can be made before the Dog Control Bylaw 2009 is instigated.

Dear Steve

I write to you in regards of a policy I would like to introduce or change to the Tasman District Council in regards to Dog Owners and the registration, licensing and Recourse Consent fees for their dogs...

Firstly I am a owner of three dogs that live in residential area and I have found out that I have to apply for a resource consent to have these animals. The cost for this is around \$800.00 dollars. Only today before writing this letter I was notified that this consent has been reduced to \$ 475.00 deposit with the possibility of a return should the consent be straight forward and take little time to process...

Upon notification in a letter from the TDC I was asked to fill out the attached form and send in with my signed approval forms from my neighbors. There was no such form just the covering letter and some paper work on resource consents for land use and change of use etc.

I went on to the TDC web site to find the appropriate forms only to discover that in the TDC 2004 referendum on dog owners there is no requirement for three or more dogs. There is a license to be had but nothing more. My wife and I called the council and made appointment to solve the problem. At the meeting we found out that the blue book with all the policies in it say the requirement is for two or more dogs. So you can see that we are a little confused and disgusted that we have to pay such a large amount just to have three dogs and the council cant even get their own facts right. At the current registration date we are up for \$ 607.00 dollars... There are many elderly people and the financially inept out there that are in the same position as us and I am sure they avoid the TDC like the plague to avoid costs.

Now I believe the Nelson City council abolished this requirement as it seemed a waste of time and undue expense on the owners parts. It also has been proven that as far as a nuisance for neighbors go two dogs or more make less noise and are less troublesome than one dog due to the fact they keep each other company. I will add that both my neighbors where surprised and didn't think we had dogs as they are so quiet where one neighbor has one dog and he barks all day long. I will add at this stage that a lot of dog owners consider their pets as their children and the council wouldn't charge a family for having three or more children would they. Now thats the down side for the owners.

The flip side is that the TDC would be missing out on revenue because dog owners to avoid this ridiculous charge wont bother registering their dogs or at least the extra ones. Yes they are at risk to fines but do you really think that will make a difference. The owners could also just register extra dogs with a mate and the council would never know.

There is more than one way to deal with issue and in doing so I propose a new policy. This policy would require a element of correspondence and work from both parties the TDC and the Dog owners. It is envisioned that should this policy take effect that more owners wont be reluctant to avoid fees and the well being of their animals will takes precedence.

I request that a **good owner reward system** be placed, the reward being a cheaper registration and the full knowledge that the dog owner is doing the best for their animals.
What is required:-

The TDC will be required to keep records of all dogs.

The TDC will monitor all owners of dogs by a visit from a council approved Dog Officer. This Officer is to report back to the head office and local Vets re any issue regarding the well being of the animals. And also to report changes etc.

Also this Officer will have the responsibility to issue a **good owner reward system**.

Consideration will be given to those in a financially inept situation and those owners that have looked after their pets for many years without issues.

The consideration of three or more dogs should be viewed by the Officer and appropriate reasonable charges applied. (possibly standard rate for first two dogs extra so on) and consideration for three house(lap dogs) against three large free roaming dogs and associated problems created by these animals

The Owner

Owners will be required to follow the rules set out in the TDC 2004 referendum on owners and their dogs . Covers items such as fencing, handling and general care.

Owner will be required to have and provide proof all dogs under their charge chipped and taken to a vet for a annual check yearly .

The Owners dogs unless required for breeding must be spayed or neutered.

The Owners must comply with all requests from the Dog Officer. Charge may apply for multiple visits.

The Idea of putting this policy forward I feel will benefit all those concerned.

The TDC will have a better control over the pets in their district

The TDC will benefit with the knowledge that they are doing the best for their community.

The Owners will benefit with the knowledge that they are doing the best for their pets.

Unregistered Animals may become a thing of the past.

The Pet will have the best care possible.


Councils throughout New Zealand have adopted this sort of proposal with fantastic results. I myself have been a dog owner for many years and have benefited in this way.

Let me first introduce myself as a dog owner, and someone who values native wildlife.

My objections are:

1. Inappropriate designation of "Motupipi Estuary- the area between the cemetery and the internal boundary of the golf course" in Golden Bay as a "Controlled Dog Exercise Area"
2. Error in pamphlet on this Draft policy issued to all dog owners, stating that "Ligar Bay Beach is a Dog Prohibited Area in summer months between the hours of 5.00am and 9.00am."

My reasons are:

1. Motupipi Estuary is a site frequented by protected migratory waders (the bar-tailed godwit and the red knot) and other protected native wader species (spoonbill, white heron, grey heron and oystercatchers). Your policy is contradictory. In one category, Dog Prohibited Areas, dogs are prohibited on "Pohara Beach from the sign at the western end of the golf course to the mouth of the Motupipi estuary" and again at "the Motupipi Estuary, excluding dog exercise area". Since the designation of prohibited areas is to protect the waders from disturbance by dogs, to designate part of this wetland a "dog exercise area" is undoing all the good the prohibited area designations hope to do.
2. This should read: "Ligar Bay Beach is a Dog Prohibited Area in summer months **except** between the hours of 5.00am and 9.00am."

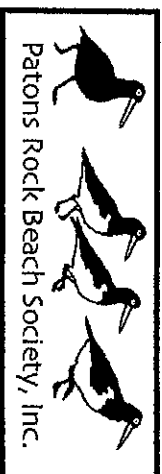
My objections would be met by:

Submission of the Patons Rock Beach Society Inc on the review of the dog control byelaws 2009-06-24

With the increasing population of Blue Penguins which had almost disappeared from the area, it is necessary that the nesting of these birds is protected.

They nest along the beach and especially in front of the settlement where residents have provided nesting boxes. It is necessary to ensure that dogs are on a leash over this whole area especially during nesting times which extends over the winter months and into summer.

To be effective in giving the birds protection, dogs should be under control throughout the year and not just the months now indicated.

There are also variable Oyster catchers nesting at both ends of the beach which can be disturbed by unrestrained dogs. There are warning notices placed on the beach near the Pariwhakaoa river, but no warning of nesting Oyster catchers is in place at the headland end of the beach.

Some owners are really responsible and ensure their dogs are under control and do not foul the beach and they unfortunately will be penalised by any change to the rules. However there are others who do not, and need to be dealt with.

There is no one designated to act as a warden who lives in the area. To have a controlling officer in Richmond is not going to be very effective if dogs are out of control on a beach in Golden Bay. Someone local needs to have authority to deal with dog owners who have no regard for the rules.

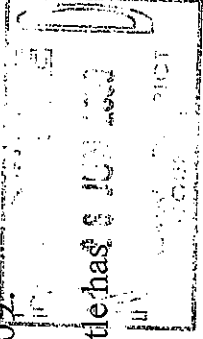

Submission to the review of dog control bylaws 2009



I made a submission to the 2004 bylaw review and very little has changed.

1. Since 2004 there has been a steady increase in blue penguins nesting in the whole Patons Rock beach, especially in front of the existing settlement.

It is now appropriate to place a dogs "on leash zone" over the settlement area outside the closed times as these birds are preparing for nesting over the winter period and into the summer months.

2. The closed times need to be extended from November to April. This beach gets a lot of use beyond the present closed times Dec 1st to 1st March and dogs fouling the beach and poor control issues are an on going problem after the present closed period.

3. The zone west of the settlement should be a "dogs on leash" restriction over the full year. There are variable oyster catchers and blue penguins nesting or preparing to nest in this zone all year round and they need protecting.

4. It is time there were wardens appointed in all beach settlement areas in Golden Bay. Wardens need the ability to issue infringement notices to dog owners who do not observe the bylaws. Infringements need to be dealt with at the time and not through TDC. after hours or the dog control person that lives outside the Bay. This was proposed in the last review but never implemented.

5 Takaka Township should be a "No Dog" zone.

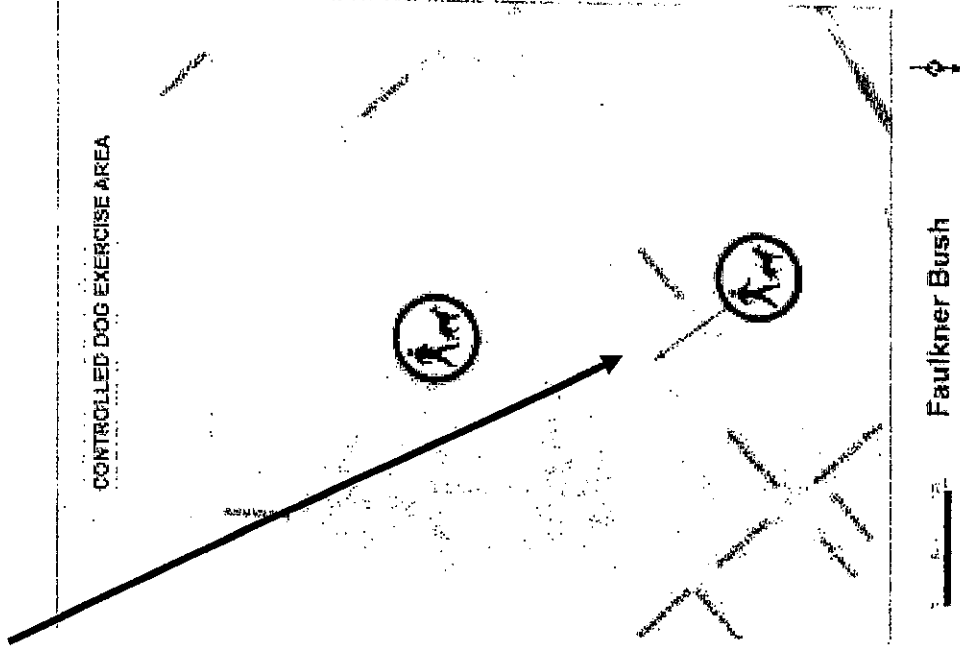

SCHEDULE 1

LEASH CONTROL AREAS

Every dog shall be kept under continuous control by means of a leash, lead or chain which is secured or held by a person capable of restraining the dog so that the dog cannot break loose, while that dog is:

1. In an urban area or cemetery
2. In the presence of protected birds or protected wildlife
3. In the presence of stock, unless that dog is being used solely or principally for the herding or driving of the stock.
4. Faulkner Bush Reserve picnic area as defined on attached map.



Note that a Resource Consent is required if three or more dogs are kept on a property in a Residential Zone.

8 Diseased Dogs

Every dog owner must ensure that any dog known to be infected with Parvovirus, Distemper, Hepatitis or other contagious disease, is contained on his or her land or premises in such a manner that it cannot freely leave the land or premises other than when being transported to a registered veterinary clinic for treatment.

9 Removal of Faeces

The owner or any person in possession of any dog that defecates in a public place or private way or on land or premises other than that occupied by the owner shall immediately remove or cause to be removed the faeces left by the dog. Where a public litter bin or similar receptacle is used to dispose of the faeces they must be suitably wrapped or contained to prevent such receptacle from being fouled.

10 Dogs Becoming a Nuisance or Injurious to Health

10.1 The owner or occupier of any premises whereon any dog or dogs are customarily kept shall take adequate precautions to prevent the keeping of such dogs from becoming a nuisance or injurious to health.

10.2 If in the opinion of an authorised officer the keeping of such dogs on such premises has become or is likely to become a nuisance or injurious to health, the authorised officer may by notice require the owner or occupier of such premises to do all or any of the following:

- (a) to reduce the number of dogs kept on the premises;
- (b) to construct, alter, reconstruct, or otherwise improve the kennels or other buildings used to house or contain such dog or dogs;
- (c) to require such dog or dogs to be tied up or otherwise confined during specified periods;
- (d) to take such other action as the authorised officer deems necessary to minimise or remove the likelihood of nuisance or hazard or injury to health.

10.3 If the authorised officer is of the opinion that the keeping of dogs on any premises is or is likely to become a nuisance or injurious to health he or she may by notice to the occupier of those premises prohibit the keeping of dogs on those premises.

10.4 Any person who fails to comply within the time specified by such notice given under the preceding provision of this section, commits an offence against this Bylaw.

11 Housing

11.1 Every dog owner must provide his or her dog with suitable housing or kennelling which:

- (a) is weatherproof, dry, clean and gives the dog adequate space, warmth and shade; and
- (b) is situated in a position that does not cause a nuisance to any person.
