Clean recycling materials are accepted at no charge at the following recycling stations, which are open 24 hours a day:

- Collingwood: 6 Tasman Street
- Takaka: 16 Willow Street
- Mārahau: 244 Sandy Bay-Mārahau Road
- Murchison: 41 Matakītaki West Bank Road

You can recycle clean plastic (numbers 1–7, hard plastic only), clean tins/cans and clean paper and cardboard.

In addition, recycling and waste can be disposed at any of the five Resource Recovery Centres in Tasman District.

- Collingwood: 93 Bainham-Collingwood Road
- Takaka: 45 Scott Road
- Motueka: 93 Robinson Road, Lower Moutere
- Richmond: 14 Fittal Street
- Murchison: 41 Matakītaki West Bank Road

Please dispose of other waste (anything that is not recyclable) in a Tasman District Council rubbish bag or pay for disposal at a Resource Recovery Centre. You can purchase the bags in any supermarket.



Free wastewater disposal points:

- Golden Bay: i-SITE Visitor Centre, 16 Willow Street, Takaka and 8 William Street, Collingwood
- Motueka: 29 Marchwood Park Road
- Richmond: 14 Fittal Street
- St Arnaud: Kerr Bay Camping Ground (Nelson Lakes National Park), 52 Lake Road
- Tapawera: 85 Main Road (donations requested)
- Murchison: entrance to the Riverview Campground, 19 Riverview Road
