Thank you for your email dated 2nd September relating to the renaming of High Street South. Council staff have just forwarded this to the Motueka Community Board members this afternoon. The point you highlight is one of merit and I attach a copy of the agenda for the February 2020 meeting when the Board agreed to the name change. It is with a heartfelt apology that I must accept that the report on which the decision was made had no cultural considerations. In fact ironically it had a climate change consideration but was lacking to acknowledge any suggested consultation with mana whenua iwi.

For this as Chair and the mover of the motion I take responsibility for this oversight.

I will table your letter at our next Board meeting and seek clarification over the process for street naming within Motueka and highlight the importance of consultation with mana whenua iwi.

- Local Alcohol Policy review. Submissions close on Friday Sept. 25th. Hearings for submissions on Wed Oct 14th.
- Bio Strategy Policy meeting at Motueka Community House, on 15th September, from 7pm. (TONIGHT).
- Domestic Water Safety Policy. Submissions close Oct. 2nd.
- Freshwater Management Programme, conducted by the

Ministry for the Environment (MFE). Relates to the National Policy Statement & the National Environmental Standard 2020.

Relevant to Motueka :- Wetlands; Agricultural Intensification Fish Passage; Stream fencing — see MFE website for factsheets.

31 Dec, 2024 scheduled as deadline for Councils.

- Long Term Plan policies, projects 2021-31 ongoing. Public submissions called Feb, 2021.
- Memorial Park. Irrigation bore has been replaced, including pump & meter.
