- New car park

# Items for consultation with Saxton Field Committee:

- 1. THE CHAMPION GREEN FACILITIES COMMITTEE as representing several sporting code user groups, wish to be consulted on the workshop outcomes in the review process of the Saxton Field Reserve Management Plan (SFRMP). The timing of this would possibly be in September October this year.
- 2. THE CHAMPION GREEN FACILITIES COMMITTEE wish to be consulted on future Marketing Strategies especially in reference to the identified areas of the SWOT analysis.
- **3.** THE CHAMPION GREEN FACILITIES COMMITTEE wish to discuss with Council staff as soon as possible the current proposed spending allocations on Capital Projects as below: We are strong advocates in assisting staff to find ways NOT to spend unnecessarily on projects that are not currently needed by user groups.
  - > Velodrome lights \$60 000
  - Velodrome sunshade installation costs
  - ➤ Mountain bike track \$30 000 (These 3 projects alone could wipe the \$115 000 liability debt owed by the Saxton Velodrome Trust being carried by the Councils)
  - Proposed Champion Road to Saxton Field link road. \$800 900 000 estimate.

All of these Capital Projects are up for approval and to date user sports codes **have not had any input** into either their planning, their need or their financial viability.

In excess of a million dollars could be saved on such proposed works.

# SUBMISSION TO SAXTON FIELDS COMMITTEE 22 May 2019



Submission by - Nelson Heat Baseball (NHB)

Purpose of submission - to request a permanent home for baseball in Nelson.

#### REQUEST

To accommodate the growth within the code nationally and locally, we need a permanent home for baseball in Nelson that provides access to a playing diamond throughout the year, rather than season to season.

We are requesting the following solutions:

## 1. PERMANENT HOME - CHAMPION GREEN

The new access from Champion Road, along with shared parking with the Velodrome and access to the toilets, changing rooms and storage at Avery, makes Champion Green an excellent home for baseball in Nelson.

It would, however, need appropriate ground works at Champion Green during the winter months to bring the field up to the same standard as Avery.

Once allocated Champion Green as a permanent home, NHB would be able to undertake fundraising & sponsorship initiatives to start investing in an infield diamond surface, fencing, dug-out facilities and batting cages.

An outfield of 130m would allow us to play both junior and senior baseball.

## 2. ACCESS FOR HOSTED REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS - AVERY FIELD

During Labour weekend 2018, NHB hosted the inaugural Nelson Heat Invitational tournament, with three visiting teams from Levin and Christchurch. The tournament was held at Greenmeadows, with the temporary set-up of two diamonds; one for u13 teams and one for u16 teams.

It was thanks to partnerships with Nelson Cricket and Nelson Basketball that NHB was able to deliver a successful tournament for the visiting teams, who have all subsequently committed to returning again for Labour weekend 2019.

We would like to request access to Avery field each year for our Nelson Heat Invitational tournament held in October, where, alongside a diamond at Champion Green, we could host a tournament with shared toilet facilities, parking and more importantly officials and spectators.

## 3. ACCESS FOR HOSTED NATIONAL & LOCAL TOURNAMENTS - SAXTON DIAMONDS

Nelson Softball Association (NSA) and NHB have recently met and agreed to start reconciling the relationship between the two codes, in the interest of growing both sports.

As such, NSA has agreed to allow NHB to use Saxton Diamonds to host a National u13 tournament, along with access to train players on the all-weather skin diamonds. We have submitted a proposal to Baseball New Zealand for 2020 - 2022.

NHB is also able to use Saxton Diamonds to host our annual Teeball tournament for primary schools across the region; the date for the tournament in 2019 is 25 September.

Due to the fundamental difference between the game of softball and baseball, Saxton Diamonds would only allow baseball games for junior teams, up to u13.

#### HISTORY

Following a presentation to the Saxton Fields Committee in November 2018, with a request for a permanent home and a safe environment for our players, we were allocated the usage of Avery Fields from January to April 2019.

Not only did the move to Avery provide a safe playing field for our players, the access to changing rooms, toilets and storage facilities encouraged more player and family participation in our sport. During the second half of our 2018/19 season, we continued to grow.

We believe the move to a safe playing environment allowed our players to remain competitive at a national level, with good results at both the u16 and u13 National tournaments, and also contributed to our players continuing to success in representing New Zealand, with seven players selected to play in Japan and the United States in July & August this year.

With these successes however, comes the need to be able to train all year round and therefore a permanent home.

Without a permanent home, we have no where to train during our off season and any investment the club has made in fencing, pitching mounds and signage, has had to also be temporary.

## Growth of baseball in Nelson and New Zealand


Alongside the growth of player numbers, Nelson Heat has developed a stronger understanding of the game with attendance at national coaching weekends in Auckland and initiating national-level scoring and umpiring clinics in Nelson.

Seven Nelson Heat Baseball players currently represent New Zealand in age group baseball.

Following another successful 2018/19 season of baseball, highlighted by growth in player and supporter numbers, along with the success of players selected to represent New Zealand, we are preparing for further growth in the coming years.

To meet the growth we will be introducing new playing grades for u11 and u19.
